

Is Your TRN Valid in Dubai? Here's How to Check

Step 1: Gather your TRN and UAE Identification Card, then head to the Ministry of Interior website and create an account there. After you've created an account, you'll have to log in to the website and click on the National Cards Services tab to get to the page that will allow you to check whether your TRN is valid or not. Step 2: Once you have done this, all you need to do is enter your TRN into the field called Search by Document Number on that page. What is a The Regional Number (TRN)?

A TRN is a unique 10-digit number issued by Etisalat for individuals and businesses registered in UAE. It is valid for 2 years. If you move out of UAE before your TRN expires, it will not be renewed. However, you can take your phone number with you by asking your new carrier to port your number within 7 days after you get settled into your new home.

Three Ways to Verify Your TRN Number Online

If you're moving to another country, such as The United Arab Emirates, you will need a residence permit (commonly referred to as a TRN). That number is unique and specific to you. As with any government-issued ID or document, it's a good idea for expats to verify their TRNs when they arrive—or even before they leave their home countries.

Four Ways to Verify Your Personal Identification Documents

It's important that all of your documents are valid and up-to-date if you're planning to open a business in Dubai. If your resident visa isn't valid, you can end up paying fines or even being arrested by police. That's why it's so important that you verify all of your identification documents before setting foot outside your home. Thankfully, there are four easy ways for expats to do just that!

Five Alternatives to The Regional Number (TRN) in the UAE

If you're planning a move to Dubai, it's a good idea to obtain an alternative ID. Residents of Dubai are required by law to have a valid Emirates ID (called Emirates Identity Card or TRN card) but many expats and internationals choose not to apply for one for various reasons.
